Whether you are a mom, a step mom, an aunt, a grandmother, a big sister or just a loving friend, the role of a 'mother' is important and necessary in a girl's development. Utilizing a guide created with the support of the Dove Self-Esteem Fund, participants will take part in activities and discussions designed to raise self-esteem by encouraging mothers and daughters to embrace their own inner and unique beauty.
